The 2012 Technical Assistance Institute is designed to complement the strategic framework for the Administration on Developmental Disabilities (ADD). Elements of the strategic framework include:

Protection of rights and prevention of abuse, neglect and exploitation

Access to health and social supports, culturally competent services and supports, safety, self-directed services and supports, and full meaningful community participation.

Empowering individuals with developmental disabilities and their families

Increasing self-determination and personal control in decisions; family support and education; educating parents/caregivers about the possibilities for the future; futures planning; community-based systems change; and flexible service models and consumer-directed approaches.

Employment first, competitive, integrated employment

Increasing opportunities for real work with real pay; reducing benefits barriers and increasing employment support services; interagency collaboration; and DD Network collaboration.

Accountability & Sustainability

Continued improvements in grantee planning and reporting efforts and development, evaluation and dissemination of best practices.

Supporting advocacy efforts of individuals with developmental disabilities

Continued progression of the Self-Advocacy movement; training and supports; inclusion of people with most significant disabilities, including those from diverse backgrounds (un-served and under-served, ethnicity, low-income individuals); and collaboration between the DD Network and self-advocacy organizations.
