
The Washington Experience: Taxonomy Activity

What is a taxonomy?

A taxonomy is a way to depict the relationships between a series of things. There are scientific taxonomies to look at different life forms on the basis of biology, and there are social taxonomies to look at the ways that different groups interact. We are going to do the latter, focusing on what groups are involved in the creation, development, and implementation of disability policy.

The Iron Triangle

The Iron Triangle is a way to look at policymaking through the relationship between interest groups, and the congressional/policymaking arena.
